

EDA Certification in the PhD Program
Approved by EDA Program Area April 26, 2004
Approved by PhD Advisory Committee June 18, 2004

The Educational Administration Program offers a 39-hour program leading to Administrator Certification. The EDA program area approved the following outline as a plan for PhD students to earn certification.

The student must have earned a Master's degree in an educational field.

The PhD courses in the right hand column can be substituted for the EDA courses in the left hand column.

Elective/Transfer credit/ Evidence from portfolio

The following courses are also required:

- 6342 Curriculum Design (3)
- 6344 Campus Leadership (3)
- 6348 Law (3)
- 6388 Practicum (6)

Students may use current procedures for transfer credit or presentation of portfolio as evidence for a waiver of the above courses. These EDA courses can also be taken as one of the three electives required in the PhD program if they are offered at the doctoral 7000 level.

The Qualifying examination and the Comprehensive examination with portfolio in the PhD program will substitute for the Level I Assessment in the EDA program.

Approval

The above outline is meant as a guide. The EDA program coordinator will give final approval. Requirements may be added based on the experience of the student. A plan will be designed for each student on a case-by-case basis.
